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1. COLLEGE PROFILE

1.1 About Don Bosco

Father and Educator of Youth

John Bosco was born on 16th August 1815 at a little hamlet called Becchi, in northern Italy. He was the youngest son of Francesco Bosco and Margeret Occhiena. When John was two, his father died, and despite all odds, John wanted an education to become a priest. When he was nine, Bosco had the first of a series of dreams which would play an influential role in his work and outlook. The man in the dream said to him: "You will have to win these friends of yours not with blows, but with gentleness and kindness". At fourteen, he found a tutor. At fifteen, he began taking jobs of any kind to pay for lodging and school. At the age of twenty-six, he realized his dream of becoming a priest in 1841.

Don Bosco's capability to attract numerous boys and adult helpers was connected to his "Preventive System of Education". He believed education to be a "matter of the heart" and said that the boys must not only be loved, but know that they are loved. His system of education was rooted on three components, namely, Reason, Religion and Loving Kindness.

Historians know him as a social innovator, saint and educator and common people claim him as a publisher and builder. Religious minded people claim him as a clairvoyant, visionary and prophet. Churchmen and psychologists wonder at the catalogue of his prophetic dreams and miracle. But his special mission was the care of youth. He gave them food, enriched their minds, taught them trades and filled their souls with peace and joy. The

Church has proclaimed him a saint and the "Father and Teacher of Youth".

Salesians of Don Bosco (SDB) in India

Don Bosco founded a religious society of priests and brothers whom he called "Salesians". Today, they are known as the "Salesians of Don Bosco". Over the years, Don Bosco's works have multiplied and spread out all over the world. Today the Salesians are about 14,232 members, serving the youth in about 134 countries.

Don Bosco's followers arrived in India in the year 1906 and today their mission is spread in almost all the states of India with nearly 2400 Salesians working in 575 institutions for the welfare of the young people. Salesian works in India include a university, number of colleges and professional institutes, academic schools, technical institutions, youth centers, parishes and other youth related projects. Don Bosco is much loved in India and his system of education has transformed the lives of millions of young people.

இளைஞர்களின் நண்பனும் வழிகாட்டியும்

ஜான் போஸ்கோ 1815 ஆகஸ்ட் 16ஆம் நாள் இத்தாலி நாட்டில் பெக்கி என்னும் குக்கிராமத்தில் பிறந்தார். அவர் பிரான்சிஸ் போஸ்கோ மற்றும் மார்க்ரெட் ஆகியோரின் இளையமகன் ஆவார். ஜான் இரண்டு வயது இருக்கும் போது அவரது தந்தை இறந்து விட்டார். விதவையான மார்க்ரெட், நோய்வாய்ப்பட்ட மாமியார்,ஒரு கைக்குழந்தை மற்றும் இரண்டு மகன்களுடன் ஒரு பண்ணையில் வாழ்ந்து வந்தார்.

ஒன்பது வயதாக இருக்கும்போது போஸ்கோ ஒரு கனவு கண்டார். அக்கனவில் இளையோரை அன்பில் ஆட்கொள்ள வேண்டும் என அவருக்கு அருளப்பட்டது. 1841ஆம் ஆண்டு அவரது 26வது வயதில் குருவாகத் திருநிலைப்படுத்தப்பட்டபோது தனது கனவு நனவானதை தொன்போஸ்கோ உணர்ந்தார். "இளையோர்மேல் அக்கறை உள்ள குருவாக இருக்க விரும்புகிறேன்" என்ற விருதுவாக்குடன் தமது பணிவாழ்வைத் தொழிற்சாலை நகரமான தூரினில் முதலில் துவங்கினார். அவர் துவங்கிய முதல் மாணவர் இல்லம் ஒரு புறக்கணிக்கப்பட்ட கட்டடித்தில் அமைந்திருந்தது. அவர் அந்த இல்லத்தில் கல்வியோடு தொழிற்கல்வியையும் கற்றுக் கொடுத்தார். அவரது பணியில் அவரது அன்னை மார்க்ரெட்டும் தன்னை இணைத்துக் கொண்டார்.

தொன் போஸ்கோ தமது மாணவர்களையும், உதவியாளர்களையும், தம்முடைய பணியில் ஈடுபடுத்தினார். "கல்வி என்பது இதயத்தைச் சார்ந்தது" என்பதை நம்பினார். அவருடைய கல்விமுறையானது மூன்று கூறுகளாக வேருன்றப்பட்டது.அவையாவன: அறிவு, ஆன்மீகம்மற்றும் அன்பு.

வரலாற்று அறிஞர்கள், தொன் போஸ்கோவை சமூக ஞானியாகவும்,புனிதர் மற்றும் கல்வியாளராகவும் கருதுகின்றனர். பொதுமக்கள்,அவரை ஒரு எழுத்தாளராகவும் மற்றும் ஆன்மீக எண்ணம் கொண்டோர் தொன் போஸ்கோவை சித்தர்,மற்றும் தீர்க்கதரிசி என்றும் அழைப்பார்கள். திருச்சபையினரும் மற்றும் உளவியலாளர்களும் அவருடைய தீர்க்கதரிசனக் கனவுகள் மற்றும் அதிசயங்களைப் பற்றி ஆச்சரியப்படுகின்றனர்.

இளையோரை வழிகாட்டும் பணியில் அவர் சிறந்துவிளங்கினார். இளைஞருடைய ஆன்மகுருவாக அவர்களில் மனஅமைதியும் மகிழ்ச்சியும் நிறைந்திருக்கச் செய்தார். திருச்சபை தொன் போஸ்கோவை புனிதராக அறிவித்து அவரை "இளைஞர்களின் தந்தையும் ஆசானாகவும்" பிரகடனப்படுத்தியது.

தொன்போஸ்கோவின் சலேசியர்கள்

தொன் போஸ்கோ தோற்றிவித்த சலேசியசபைக் குருக்கள் மற்றும் சகோதரர்கள் "சலேசியர்கள்" என்று அழைக்கப்படுகின்றனர். இன்றும் பல வருடங்களைக் கடந்து அவரது பணிகள் 134 நாடுகளில் 14232 சலேசியர்களைக் கொண்டு இளைஞர்களுக்குச் சேவை செய்துவருகின்றது.

போஸ்கோவின் சலேசியர்கள் 1906ஆம் ஆண்டு கொன் அடியெடுத்து வைத்தனர். இந்தியாவில் சுமார் 2400 சலேசியர்கள் 575 நிறுவனங்களில் இந்தியாவிலுள்ள அனைத்து மாநிலங்களிலம் இளைஞர்களின் நலன்களுக்காகப் பணியாள்ளி வருகின்றார்கள். பல்கலைக்கமகம், கல்லூரிகள். தொழிற்க்கல்வி நிறுவனங்கள், தொழில்நுட்பக் கல்லூரிகள், பள்ளிகள், இளைஞர்கள் மையம், பங்குத்தளங்கள் மற்றும் இதர இளைஞர் தொடர்பான திட்டங்கள் போன்ற எண்ணிலடங்கா சலேசியர்கள் வருகின்றனர். பணிகளில் பணியாள்ளி இந்தியர்களால் பெரிதும் நேசிக்கப்பட்ட தொன் போஸ்கோவின் கல்விமுறை எண்ணற்ற இளைஞர்களின் வாழ்க்கைமுறையை மாற்றியமைத்திருக்கின்றது.

4. SPECIAL FEATURES AND ACTIVITIES

The activities focus on institutional goals, such as building and sustaining community on campus as well as student retention. As campus become more diverse, students desire an environment in which they feel connected to others and to the College. These activities provide a place for students to come together, discuss pertinent ideas and issues, and accomplish common goals. Within this community, where students feel comfortable with one another, learning and development are enhanced and student retention is positively impacted.

1. SPECIAL CLASSES FOR SLOW LEARNERS

The students of our college come from various backgrounds. It always happens that some students need extra care and support in their learning process. Therefore, the college offers special coaching classes for the weak students /slow learners.

2. BRIDGE COURSE

A bridge course for newly admitted students is conducted every year before the commencement of the first semester classes. The main objective of the course is to bridge the gap between subjects studied at school level and subjects that they would be studying in the Graduation level.

3. CERTIFICATE COURSE

A certificate course is the shortest course of study. It is also the least expensive type of academic credential. Certificates consist of courses that help one to develop career competency in a single subject. Certification courses are basically worked for those students who are not able to avail degree programs. The duration of each course is 60 hours per year.

4. ADD - ON COURSE

The add-on course classes do not disrupt the student's academic schedule and are comfortably held on Saturdays. They will have to undertake two papers per semester. With the effective and round-the-clock tutelage of our accomplished professors, these courses equip the students with multiple skills that make them an asset to the competitive globe that awaits them outside their cocoons.

5. ONLINE COURSES

Online courses typically have an asynchronous, or self-paced, portion. Staff and Students complete coursework on their own time but still need to meet weekly deadlines, a format that offers flexibility for staff and students. National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning (NPTEL) online courses are open to everyone. These courses are aimed at college students (any engineering or science stream).

6. CAREER GUIDENCE

Once the students complete their degree, they are thrown into the competitive world of job market. They need to be fit to compete. And so, to enhance their employability the final year students are given special coaching in soft-skills and personality development for facing competitive exams and interviews.

7. ASSOCIATIONS

Each department forms an association which offers additional opportunities and space for student initiative for planning and organizing academic /co-curricular events. These activities are intended to broaden the knowledge of their subjects, facilitate exposure to recent

8. CLUBS AND GROUPS

Students in this club brainstorm ways to conserve energy and keep the surroundings clean at school and neighborhood. They are

also exposed to field activities such as Nature Trails, Quiz and Poster Designing, etc., so as to create enthusiasm regarding issues pertaining to Plants /Forest /Wildlife / Bio-diversity and Nature.

2. Red Ribbon Club (RRC)

Media Club engages students who exhibit interest and talent in photography, filming, music and dance. Students are given the opportunity to develop their skills through training programs such as video editing, short film projects, photography courses, exhibitions, field trips and competitions.

■ To explore the way social media has been used within institution such as education, commerce, the state and religion.

7. AICUF and Awareness

All India Catholic University Federation (AICUF) is a students' movement formed to develop leadership skills and increase social awareness. We are born into an unjust society and we are determined not to leave it as we have found it.

Activities

- To help students evolve spirituality that has humanization as its core, through involvement and reflection.
- To enable Christian students to play a prophetic role in their communities through a critical understanding of their faith, drawing inspiration from the Gospels, the Eucharist and their prayer.

8. Women's Cell

The Cell has both the faculty and students of the College as its members and works with an aim to create a gender sensitized community within campus as well as in the society. It has been organising varied academic, technical, medical, cultural and social events for the upliftment of women and spread the real importance of gender equality in the society through college students.

Activities

The women's cell organizes workshops and lectures on all issues concerning women.

9. Fine Arts Club

Fine Arts Club is functioning in the college to bring out the artistic talents among the students. Students are identified in the area of Vocal Music, Instrumental Music, Mimicry, Solo Dance, Group Dance, Drama, Folk Song, Short Film, Acting etc., and offered training to improve their skills in Fine Arts.

10. Quiz Club

Quiz Club is a unique and exciting way to motivate, inspire, encourage and reward children in their quest for knowledge and provide them with the opportunity to celebrate their achievements as part of a high profile, national competition. The main objective of quiz club is to popularize quize activities among students and to encourage them to take part in all competitive examination at state and central level.

Activities

■ To conduct Inter-collegiate and Intra-collegiate competitions.

11. Kalam Readers Club

Kalam Readers club is an activity where a group of friends read the books within a set period, then gather together to discuss it (everyone has their own copy). Essentially its practice combined with a habit, a non-judgemental time where students are encouraged to read and love reading.

Activities

■ Every member in the club shall review a book and share its values with the other members.

12. Student Counselling and Mentoring

Qualified and experienced youth counsellors are availed to guide, counsel and empower the students. The students are encouraged to make use of the services of the counsellors, with prior appointment. Mentoring is to accompany the student in his / her life in the college. Faculties are appointed mentors of students. The mentors meet the mentees both individually and as a group, follow up their growth and help them to handle their duties and to face the challenges arising in their academic and personal lives.

13. Rural Camp

The second year students are given opportunity for one week of rural camp. This is aimed at providing the students training and opportunities in assuring social responsibility. This gives an opportunity for the students to share the lives of the rural poor and to interact with children and youth. These interactions would motivate the rural children and youth for pursuing higher education.

14. Placement Cell

The Placement Cell plays a crucial role in locating job opportunities for Under Graduates and Post Graduates passing out from the college by keeping in touch with reputed firms and industrial establishments. The Placement Cell operates round the year to facilitate contacts between companies and graduates.

15. Religion and Ethics

Once a week religion and ethics sessions are offered to the students. In a multi-religious context, the students are given an opportunity to learn religious and moral values. Catechism classes are given for the Catholic students while the others are given moral value education. We aim at knowledge and respect of not only one's own religion but also of other religions. It is an effort to create not mere religious people but persons of spirituality.

16. Extension Department (DBCARE)

A special feature of the college is the extension department named DBCARE which stands for Don Bosco College Action for Rural Empowerment. The students are involved in the college reach-out programmes for the empowerment of the rural people. The students are expected to spend one hour every week for such activities which are regularly monitored by the respective HOD's.

17. Bosco Student Solidarity Fund (BOSS)

Bosco Student Solidarity (BOSS) Fund is a collective, voluntary initiative of the DBCAS student community as an expression of their solidarity with fellow students in need. Every student contributes a minimum of Rs.10 /- and every staff Rs.100 /- every month towards this fund and the money thus collected is deposited in a special account and operated by the Secretary, Principal and a Student Counsellor, towards assisting the deserving students. The Students Council takes charge of the monthly collection under the supervision of the Head of the Departments.

18. Parent Teachers Association (PTA)

A Parent Teachers Association is functioning effectively in the college. It has representatives from the staff and parents. The PTA helps the college administration in quite a few ways. The general body meeting of PTA is held once a year usually in March. Parents /Guardians meet the respective class–in-charge every semester to discuss the performance and progress of their children. Common issues related to student progress are discussed and decided in the annual Parent Teacher Meeting.

19. Don Bosco Past Pupils

All the past students of the college become the members of the DON BOSCO PAST PUPILS. They also form part of the Don Bosco Past Pupils network at the Province and at the National levels. All the department level, alumni meetings are conducted as per convenience. The Annual Don Bosco Past Pupils meet is conducted on January every year.

5. INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES

- (1) **Library:** 9881 books are available. The digitized library regularly stacks few journals as well.
- (2) Computer Lab: 43 latest configured systems with internet connectivity.
- (3) Language Lab: 24 updated systems with skilled software.
- (4) Accommodation: Bosco Boy's Hostel is available for male students whose native places are located afar. Auxilium Girl's Hostel is available in the next campus for female students. It is owned and maintained by the Salesian sisters. The seats are limited and offered only to girls from far.

- (5) Transportation: The College is located adjacent to the four lane national highway. Government and private buses are available to board in frequent intervals. College buses are operated to Thoothukudi, Tharuvaikulam, Kamanayakkanpatti, Pasuvanthanai, Ottapidaram, Vilathikulam, Kovilpatti and Vembar.
- (6) Reverse Osmosis (RO) Water: Water purified by reverse osmosis method is available at various places inside the campus for students at all times.
- (7) Wi-Fi: The internet connectivity is available in all places inside the campus for access of information which is strictly firewalled and limited to educational purposes. The LAN is set up in every department staffroom for better range and quicker access.
- (8) **Sports:** The campus includes a vast playground with courts for different sports under proper maintenance.

6. SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

- 1. Scholarship for SC /ST Students: SC /ST Scholarship sanctioned by the Director of Adi Dravidar Welfare Department can cover all the non-refundable fees to be paid by students of the scheduled caste and scheduled tribes and SC-Christian.
- 2. Scholarship for Minority Students: Minority Scholarship awarded by the Central Government on the basis of marks scored in the higher secondary examination. The eligible students should contact the Scholarship Desk and apply for the scholarship by submitting the Income, Community and Nativity certificate.

- **3. Farmers Scholarship:** Farmers Scholarship sanctioned for the children of the farmers.
- **4. Labour Welfare Scholarship:** Labour Welfare Scholarship sanctioned by the Labour Welfare Department of Tamilnadu.
- 5. Child Labour Scholarship: Scholarship sanctioned Post Metric Scholarships under Ministry of Labour and Employment for Either of the parent of the students should be working under Beedi, Iron Ore Manganese and Chrome Ore Mines, Limestone and Dolomite Mines, Cine worker with at least six months service.
- **6. First Generation Graduate Scholarship:** Scholarship sanctioned by Tamilnadu Government for the student should be a first graduate from their family.
- **7. Handicapped Scholarship:** Scholarship sanctioned by District Handicapped Welfare Department for the Physically Challenged students.
- **8. Free Education Scheme Scholarship:** Scholarship sanctioned by District Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare for the BC /MBC /DNC students only.
- **9. Don Bosco Foundation Scholarship:** it is sanctioned by the College Management for the following Applicant only
 - An Orphan (or) Semi-orphan.
 - Abandoned by the parents and looked after by a Guardian.
 - Sri Lankan Tamils residing at Rehabilitation Camps.
 - The first graduate from the poor family.
 - Economically (or) socially poor.

- 10. Work scholarship is an innovative program of our college. In this scheme, small work is allotted to the students and remuneration is given to their work. Under this Scheme around 200 students are getting remuneration every year.

- **11. Jindal Scholarship:** Jindal Scholarship sanctioned by Sitaram Jindal Foundation
- 12. Fr. Joseph Antony's Merit Scholarship is given to the students who get highest score from fifth semester to sixth semester from Bosco student solidarity fund. It's established out of the generous contribution from the staff and students every year.

General Code of Conduct for Students

Code of Conduct is drawn up to ensure proper and smooth functioning of the institution, and to preserve the goodwill and reputation of the college.

- 1. All students, whether inside or outside the classroom, shall stand in silence during the Prayer. They should not be found talking or walking when the College Prayer is on.
- 2. Students, both boys and girls, should come to the College decently dressed up. They should adhere to the cultural values and ethos of the College.
- 3. Students are expected to be punctual to classes. Latecomers will be admitted only in exceptional cases and with the permission of the HODs.
- 4. Loitering on verandas, corridors, staircase and other passages is discouraged as it disturbs the academic atmosphere in the campus. Strict action will be initiated against students who are found unnecessarily near the canteens, hostel blocks, playgrounds and other such places inside the college campus.
- 5. While moving from one class to another, strict silence must be observed.
- 6. Whenever students are free, they are expected to go to the Library. During free periods, they are advised to collect sports goods from the Physical Director and play in the ground.
- 7. While inside the class, students should avoid unnecessary gossip, as this would disturb their focus and attention, besides causing nuisance to the concerned teacher.

- 8. Students are expected to read all the circulars put up on the Notice Board, and act accordingly.
- 9. Use of cell phones by students inside the classrooms, whether the classes are on or not, is strictly prohibited. Cell phones would be confiscated, if students are found using them inside the classroom.
- 10. Possession of cell phones inside the examination hall is strictly banned. Bringing and keeping cell phones, cash and other valuables in their bags at the time of University examinations will be at students' own risk. College authorities cannot help in cases of theft and consequent loss. Students are advised not to bring cell phones and other valuables at the time of University examinations.
- 11. Students are warned that smoking and drinking are injurious to health and therefore, involving in these practices anywhere and at any time is dangerous. Use of tobacco, alcohol and drugs inside the College campus is strictly forbidden.
- 12. Students shall not involve in any form of ragging inside or outside the College campus.
- 13. The Institution does not take donations /capitation fees for admissions. All instances of demand for donations must be reported to the Principal.
- 14. Students should remit course fees in time. Students who do not remit the fees even after the last date of payment of fees with fine Rs.100.
- 15. Those who bring vehicles to the College are advised not to indulge in rash driving inside the campus. Strict action will be taken against those involved in rash driving.

- 16. Students should not make any payments to anybody without the knowledge and consent of the HOD / Principal.
- 17. Students are forbidden from organizing any meeting in the College or collecting money for any purpose without the prior permission of the HOD /Principal.
- 18. No student shall enter the College Office except on business and at the stipulated time.
- 19. Students are expected to hand over to the College Office any property found in any place inside the campus.
- 20. Great care must be taken in handling equipment / apparatus in the laboratories. All breakages, losses and damages must be reported at once to the HOD.
- 21. Every student should possess Identity Card with his / her photo affixed on it duly attested by the Principal. Students are expected to wear their rope identity cards inside and outside the class. Identity Card shall be shown on demand while transacting business in the bank, college office, library, and while applying for railway /bus concession, and while participating in inter-collegiate events. Identity Card shall be carried by students into the University Examination Hall, without which entry into the hall may be denied. Identity Card shall be shown to security staff manning the college gate.
- 22. A grievance redressal mechanism exists in the Institution. Students are advised to approach the Faculty-in-charge of Grievance Redressal Cell (as mentioned in this Hand Book) for getting their grievances addressed.

Code of Conduct and Professional Ethics for Teaching and Administrative Staff in the College

- 1. Every teacher shall, at all times, maintain absolute integrity and devotion to duty. They shall be strictly honest and impartial in their official dealings.
- 2. Every teaching and Non-Teaching staffs shall be present at the place of his duty during the prescribed working hours. No teachers shall be absent from duty without prior permission or grant of leave except for valid reasons or unforeseen contingencies.
- 3. Every teacher shall engage classes regularly and punctually and import lessons so as to maintain and strengthen standards of academic excellence. Their academic duties shall include guidance and instruction to students in the form of Tutorial / Seminars / Practical's and assessment / examination /valuation work assigned to them by the College / University authorities.
- 4. Every teacher shall participate fully and enthusiastically in the corporate life of the College and shall perform any other curricular or extracurricular work related to the College / University as may be assigned to them by the University authorities.
- 5. No teacher shall discriminate against any pupil on grounds of caste, creed, sect, religion, sex, nationality or language. They shall also discourage such tendencies among their colleagues and students.
- 6. Every teacher shall help the College authorities in enforcing and maintaining discipline among students.
- 7. Every teacher shall assess impartially the performance of students in tests, examinations, assignments,

- practical's, dissertations, thesis, etc., He should not indulge in over-making, under making or other attempts at victimization on any ground.
- 8. No teacher shall resort to unauthorized use of College resources or facilities for personal, commercial, political or other purpose not related to the College.
- 9. No teachers shall resort to threats of physical harm forcible detention, harassment or intimidation of any staff or students of the College with the intention of interfering with the performance of their duties.
- 10. No teacher shall refuse to carry out the decision of the appropriate administrative or academic bodies of the College.
- 11. No teacher shall without previous intimation to the College stand for election or accept nomination to any local body, legislature of the State or Parliament, nor shall be in any manner force their subordinates or students against their will for the canvassing of his election.

THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA

PREAMBLE

We, the people of India,

Having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a Sovereign socialist secular democratic republic and to secure to all its citizen; Justice, social, economic and political; Liberty of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship; Equality of status and of opportunity; And to promote among them all Fraternity assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the nation; In our constituent assembly this twenty sixth day of November, 1949, Do hereby adopt, enact and give to ourselves this constitution.
